

MINUTES OF THE EXTRAORDINARY SCHOOL COUNCIL MEETING ON THURSDAY, 27 NOVEMBER 2025

1/ A vote on changing the date for the second working Saturday

At the School Council meeting on 13 February 2025, the organisation of working Saturdays was discussed. In fact, given the number of days and hours owed and the accumulation of Ghanaian and French public holidays, there is a deficit of working days.

An agreement had been reached to work two Saturdays, on 13 September 2025 and 30 May 2026, as well as time for the open day.

We have recently learned that Accra Parents Expo will be holding an education fair on Saturday, 7 February 2025. All administrative staff and technicians will be mobilised on that day at the expo, and the school cannot be open for technical and security reasons. A vote is now required to change this date. It appears that 14 February would be the most appropriate date for this change. On that day, our school will be open to the public from 10:30 a.m. Teachers wishing to open their classrooms will adapt lessons with pupils to the desired format in order to present their work and show parents how a French school operates and how pupils work there.

In terms of organisation, this means that on Saturday 14 February 2026, primary school pupils will be in school from 8.45am and will have lessons from 9am to 12pm. Break time will be from 10am to 10.20am. The same schedule will apply to primary school pupils on the morning of 30 May.

With regard to high school students, at the next teaching council meeting, the teams will work on organising the careers forum on Saturday 31 January, the open day on Saturday 14 February and Saturday 30 May 2026.

2/ PROPOSAL BY THE CVL TO ORGANISE A WINTER PARTY ON 21 DECEMBER 2025

The parents present at the School Council recommended that the CVL:

- determine the number of participants
- identify the venue
- calculate the price based on the costs

Mrs Dauer and the parents indicate that it will be necessary for this evening to be supervised by adults to prevent any problems, as neither the parents nor the management will take responsibility for organising such an evening without control and supervision of the event.

Mrs Dauer informs the members of the School Council that the Ambassador is opening the Residence de France to LFIA pupils and parents. A proposal is made to hold the evening event at this venue. Parents are also in favour of this, given the security and symbolic significance of the location.
